Personal Profile:

While my practice is rooted in painting I work across a range of media making films, prints, objects and installations.

My work explores ideas around taste, consumption and display and their relationship to ecology. My projects focus on contested sites, geographic or cultural, that provide the backdrop for constantly evolving collisions of interest from museum collections to leisure, environmental habitat change to global commodities and their histories.

Bloom at the Horniman Museum and Gardens interrogated the varied histories connecting the museum collection weaving narratives from the burgeoning eighteenth century trade in luxury goods from China – wallpapers and porcelain – to plant collecting and the layered taxonomy narratives of selected museum artefacts in the collection, some of these themes being further explored in *Phytopia* and *Common Ground*.
